"THE HARLEM RENAISSANCE: A QUEST FOR PLACE"

FEBRUARY 14th, 2017



In Harlem, New York, in the 1920s a remarkable rebirth of African American arts flourished. Dr. Melvin L. Macklin will give a brief history of the Harlem Renaissance. He will demonstrate through music, readings, and power point how the cultural, social, and artistic expressions of that time have inspired generations

of African Americans through the decades. Audience participation and interaction will be encouraged.

Dr. Melvin L. Macklin is currently Assistant Professor of English at Ferrum College, where he teaches African American literature as well as the literature of the Holocaust. He holds a bachelor degree from Southern Illinois University,

a master's degree from Prairie View A & M University, and a doctorate degree in Arts & Humanities from the University of Texas at Dallas. He is the author of four books on the history of the African Americans in his hometown of Carbondale Illinois and rural Jackson County of Southern Illinois. His doctoral dissertation, "Children of Chaos: Historical Atrocity and Youth Survival in The Literature of American Slavery and the Holocaust," centers particularly on African American children



caught up in the slave era of early America as well as children victims of the Holocaust of Nazi Germany.
