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“FOODS IN THE BIBLE”

October 8th, 2019



Dr. Ben Huddle will present “Foods in the Bible.”

The Bible is full of references to foods. Indeed, biblical territory is often called “the land of milk and honey”. Some foods, such as “manna”, are mystical, and found nowhere else in the written literature. Others, such as bread, are common foods around the world. Wine was the common beverage. Fruits and vegetables were plentiful. Fish was the most common meat, but other meats were available. A number of herbs and spices were used in a variety of manners, providing sweet, savory and pungent aromas and tastes. A number of foods are specifically banned in the Bible. This talk will investigate many of the foods in the Bible, and will include some demonstrations. We will end with some important conclusions.

Ben Huddle was born in Ootacamund, India in 1941 and raised in Kyoto and Tokyo, Japan. He graduated from Lenoir-Rhyne College with a B.S. in Chemistry in 1963, and from the University of North Carolina with a Ph.D. in Physical Chemistry in 1968. He has taught at Roanoke College since 1968. He has also held short-term positions at Hollins University and at Sang Ji University in Wonju, Korea. He had a sabbatical at the Western Regional Forensic Lab in Roanoke. His research has focused on x-ray crystallography, homology, and forensic chemistry laboratory experiments. Although he retired in 2012, he continues to teach one section of General Chemistry at Roanoke College.
