OUTREACH CAMP July 17 – July 23, for Rising 7th - 12th Graders

During this week, we will divide into small groups to work with neighbors to remodel the houses of the elderly and those in need in our community. You will have a chance to try your hand at basic carpentry, painting or landscaping.
