**Non-Prescription (Over The Counter) Medications (including vitamins) AND Prescription Medications CAN be sent by parents/guardians to be STORED BY CAMP STAFF for administration to campers. NP/OTC Meds should be sent in the original container labeled with the camper's name. Prescription Meds should be in the original container with the prescription label intact identifying the prescribing doctor, the name of the medication, the dosage and frequency of administration. CAMPERS ARE NOT ALLOWED TO KEEP MEDICATIONS OF ANY KIND WITH THEM DURING CAMP, except for emergency medications (like inhalers). However, these medications MUST be CHECKED IN with camp staff, first, so that staff is aware of the medication and is able to monitor its location and use.
