Presentation and discussion led by Tina L. Hanlon, and Lana A. Whited! From ghoulies and ghosties and long-legged beasties and things that go bump in the night Good Lord deliver us.

The British prayer about "ghoulies and ghosties" feels especially pertinent as the air turns chilly and the leaves begin to fall. Halloween is just around the corner, and no other widely celebrated holiday so effectively reminds us of a peculiarly human trait: some of us *enjoy* being frightened. Most of us can name stories and other narratives that we associate with the holiday, from traditional short stories such as "The Legend of Sleepy Hollow" to the contemporary Harry Potter novels, and other media including Orson Welles's famous radio broadcast of *The War of the Worlds*, television depictions and films such as "It's

the Great Pumpkin, Charlie Brown," The Addams Family, and Hocus Pocus.

Younger audiences are no exception; children may be *more* engrossed than adults in tales featuring haunted places, witches and wizards, or dangers awaiting them in the forest, while adolescents are increasingly drawn to stories of warped societies presented in dystopian fiction and films such as *The Hunger Games* series, in which competitors of their own ages fight to the death in an arena–the competition televised to their fellow citizens.

Of course, scary or disturbing narratives are often the target of censorship efforts, usually involving public schools or libraries. We are reminded of this fact, as this program falls only a week or so after Banned Book Week, an annual event sponsored by the American Library Association. At the same time, some psychologists and leading experts in the relatively young field of chil-



dren's and adolescent literature argue that exposure to difficult themes and events is a worthwhile, even necessary, aspect of normal maturation, just as Stephen King has assured us all that horror films and stories have psychological value and allow adults to exorcise our more negative thoughts and urges.
